Your boss is giving a cash bonus for each stupid gaffe and asinine move you record Cohort *or anyone else* make. Anything embarrassing goes on *Behind the Masks* and earns you dough.

Speaking of cash, you're looking for additional sources of income. Maybe you can make promises you don't intend to keep to Powerbroker, or maybe you can swipe some funky artifacts from Mr. Miracle's lair and sell them off to collectors. Anything to finance your next project, whatever that will be. Maybe something about disenfranchisement in Peruvian politics? Abuse of the rules by Olympic officials?

Who You Know:

Cohort is a blowhard, and it's your job to catch her acting stupid.

Cell Phone Guy is supposedly in charge here, but you answer to the network, not to this guy. Seems to mean well, though.

Powerbroker is a slimeball agent trying to exploit poor confused time-travelling viking **Bjorn Yesterday**.

Nestor is an old-time superhero. You did some editing work on a biopic about him last year. Wasn't he stripped of his superpowers after fighting Nauticoon top of the Statue of Liberty? That was after he accused Nauticoof using Freedom Foursome funds to pay for hookers. Not that Nestor was clean, either: he'd been addicted to coke for years.

Credenza is a superheroine you caught accidentally half-nude on the beach while filming a show about beached whales. She's been hunting you down trying to get the footage back, but you already sold it to Powerbroker. Not your problem any more. Well, you still do have a backup of it, if you think that'd get you any actual money.

Superpowers:

Ask Leading Questions: When you ask a question that assumes some fact is true ("Why were you kicked out of the Justifiers?"), then the person questioned has to beat a challenge or accept that fact (having been kicked out of the Justifiers in the past) as true. (If they can show you their character background that invalidate the question, then the question is null and void.)

Photographic Memory: Might actually be useful. Your memories are stored as literal photographs and video footage that you can review. If you need to remember something that happened, see a GM or work it out with the players involved.

Hook:

Always **talking about her boring documentaries** to anyone that will listen.
