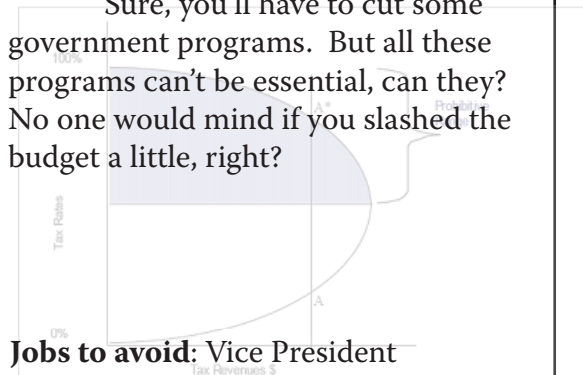


LOWER TAXES
